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

# Help to Buy Wales

Our new report shows that Help to Buy Wales has:

- Supported over 14,000, including almost 11,000 first-time buyer households.
- Generated a return of over £40 million to the Welsh Government.
- Supported 4,400 jobs and generated £240 million in economic activity every year on average.

78% of the Welsh public agree that a Government scheme to help first-time buyers should be in place, as the report outlines.

## CMA Market Study – an opportunity to build momentum

HBF's response to the Market Study drew on all available resources and expertise



The CMA set out a series of recommendations to the Welsh Government and concluded that:

- The planning process is too costly, unpredictable, and complex.
- There has been a persistent under-delivery of housing in Wales compared to estimated levels of need.
- Increased groundwork costs are a particular problem in Wales.


...and the CMA's conclusions echo the concerns HBF highlighted throughout our engagement with the organisation during the study.





## The plan led system

- While some progress with replacement LDPs continues to be made, 11 LDPs are now time expired.
- There is an insufficient pipeline of viable and deliverable sites for the years ahead.
